These students will also learn how to become stewards and what it means to be a steward of the land. This is an outdoor based program with its intentions of creating learning opportunities of fisheries programs, conservation programs, sustainable practices and stewardship practices.

## **Responsibilities and Duties:**

- Having enthusiasm and readiness for the day's tasks as guided by the SEAS Coordinator
- Will be reporting daily to SEAS Coordinator
- Maintain a detailed journal of daily activities and hours worked for payroll accuracy.
- Engage in immersive experiences with B.C. Parks park rangers, Snootli Fish Hatchery programs, and the Nuxalk Guardians Program, and outside partners to grasp the essence of their roles, their knowledge and skills.
- Participate in various activities within the Nuxalk Territory, potentially involving overnight trips.
- Ensure the care and upkeep of equipment as necessary.
- Take part in SEAS field and classroom endeavors under the guidance of the SEAS Coordinator.
- Undertake additional tasks that align with the objectives of the SEAS Summer Intern Program.

## **Minimum Requirements and Qualifications:**

- Fall within the age bracket of 16-24.
- Demonstrate reliability, enthusiasm, teamwork, and a willingness to work in outdoor settings.
- Have recent attendance in educational programs or schools, or have plans to enroll in the upcoming academic year (relevant documents may be requested).
- Must possess a Social Insurance Number.
